## Sebanyak 16 ladang babi dijangkiti ASF

**Melaka:** Selepas ancaman Covid-19 dan banjir, negeri ini dilanda krisis baru membatik penularan penyakit Demam Babi Afrika (ASF) yang menjangkiti 16 ladang babi komersial di Paya Mengkuang di Masjid Tanah, di sini.

Ketua Pengarah Jabatan Perkhidmatan Veterinar (JPV) Dr Norlizan Mohd Noor berkata bagi mengawal dan mencegah rebakan penyakit ASF, JPV menguatkuasakan *stamping out policy* menerusi pemusnahan babi ladang yang disahkan positif ASF.

"Sehingga semalam (kelmarin) sejumlah 1,864 ekor ternakan babi yang disahkan positif ASF di kawasan Paya Mengkuang terus aktif dijalankan bagi mengesan jangkitan penyakit ASF di semua 35 ladang babi di ka-

Norlizan berkata, aktiviti pemantauan, pemeriksaan klinik dan persampelan semua ladang ternakan babi di Paya Mengkuang terus aktif dijalankan bagi mengesan jangkitan penyakit ASF di semua 35 ladang babi di ka-

wasan itu.

Beliau berkata aktiviti pemantauan dan pemeriksaan juga diaktifkan membabitkan semua ladang penterakan babi di seluruh negara.

"Penternak dan orang awam diminta segera melaporkan sebarang kematian pada babi hutan, babi kampung atau babi komersial kepada Pejabat Perkhidmatan Veterinar Daerah (PPVD) atau Pejabat Perkhidmatan Veterinar Negeri yang berdekatan atau menerusi hotline Bilik Pengurusan Krisis Penyakit, Ibu Pejabat Perkhidmatan Veterinar Putrajaya (03-88702041)," katanya.

## Harga ayam di pasar tani berpatutan

**PASIR SALAK** – Lembaga Permasaran Pertanian Persekutuan (FAMA) memberi jaminan harga barang dan bahan mentah termasuk ayam yang dijual di pasar tani lebih berpatutan.

Pengerusinya, Datuk Mohd. Fasiah Mohd. Fakie berkata, peniaga dan usahawan boleh terus memasarkan hasil pertanian mereka selain disaran mengambil bekalan terus dari ladang tanpa melalui orang tengah.

Katanya, menerusi jualan secara terus dari ladang peniaga dan usahawan dapat menghapuskan orang tengah yang selama ini mendapat keuntungan sekitar 20 hingga 30 peratus.

"Dari segi kawalan harga, ia di bawah Kementerian Perdagangan Dalam Negeri dan Hal Ehwal Pengguna (KPDNHEP).

"Kita cuma berharap kalau boleh peniaga dapat mengambil hasil terus dari ladang untuk jual di pasar tani FAMA agar harga lebih rendah.

"Seperti contoh ayam yang diambil dari ladang boleh dijual

pada harga RM6 hingga RM7 lepas mengadakan lawatan kerja sekilogram," katanya.

Mohd. Fasiah berkata demikian kepada pemberita se-

lepas mengadakan lawatan kerja ke Program My Rakyat dan Pasar

Tani Kekal (PTK) Kampung Gajah, di sini, semalam.

Turut sama pada lawatan berkenaan, Ahli Parlimen Pasir

Salak, Datuk Seri Tajuddin Abdul Rahman, Timbalan Ketua

Pengarah (Operasi) FAMA, Abdur Rashid Bahri dan Pengarah FAMA Perak, Norsham Ramly.

Sementara itu, Mohd. Fasiah berkata, PTK Kampung Gajah akan memulakan operasinya pada Mac depan dengan menempatkan 91 unit iaitu 14 unit lot basah dan 70 unit lot kering serta tujuh unit medan selera.

Tambahnya PTK yang melanjutkan projek bernilai RM2.6 juta itu akan beroperasi bermula pukul 7 pagi hingga 6 petang setiap hari dengan anggaran penjanaan ekonomi bagi tahun pertama pengoperasian PTK berkenaan adalah sebanyak RM11 juta.

"90 peratus peniaga di PTK ini adalah dari daerah Perak Tengah dengan perpindahan keseluruhan peserta dari Pasar Awam Kampung Gajah ke PTK tersebut," katanya.

Menurut Mohd. Fasiah, selain Kampung Gajah, terdapat dua lagi PTK di negeri ini iaitu di Manjung dan Lekir yang telah beroperasi sejak beberapa tahun lalu serta PTK Kuala Kangsar yang dijangka beroperasi sepeleburnya pada 2023.

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## Expect smaller food portions

Eateries struggling with increase in prices of raw materials

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**PETALING JAYA:** Consumers may soon see smaller portions being served as some eateries grapple with price increases of raw food materials and other goods, says the Pan Malaysian Chinese Restaurants and Chefs Association.

Its vice-president Datuk Rungo Kaw said some operators would reduce the use of raw food and its portions, while others might reduce the volume of food to be sold.

"Essentially, reducing food portions is an increase of food price because even with smaller portions, consumers still have to pay the same (price)," he said.

He noted that some restaurateurs were left with no choice in order to maintain their earnings.

Kaw also said price hikes at eateries were inevitable as the country was still recovering from the devastating impacts of the pandemic.

He said the unpredictable weather, including heavy rains, which resulted in floods and landslides, had affected the production of raw ingredients.

"Consequently, restaurant owners will need to spend more to procure raw food materials," he said.

Kaw said prices of poultry had increased by 20% recently and food operators were struggling to cope.

On top of raw food materials, restaurant owners also have to bear



the 35% additional cost of non-food materials such as plastic bags, sanitising equipment and other overhead costs.

"Both operators and consumers are struggling and need to survive during these difficult times."

"I just hope everyone, including the consumers, understands the situation restaurant owners are facing," he said.

Malaysian Indian Muslim Restaurant Owners Association (Presma) president Datuk Jawahar Ali Taib Khan said their members would be keeping their food affordable especially for those in the lower income (B40) bracket.

If price increases were necessary, he said they would make sure they

were minimal to avoid burdening consumers.

"We are doing our part to help Malaysians during this hard time," he said.

Meanwhile, he said customers had the right to decide whether to dine in at restaurants that imposed higher prices.

"Those restaurant operators are doing so probably because the operating costs are higher compared to others," he said.

He noted that location of restaurants also contributed to the increase of food prices as some owners had to pay higher rentals.

"The price of a piece of roti canai might be RM1.50 in the suburbs but it could be more (expensive) in the cities," Jawahar Ali said.

However, he said consumers could also lodge complaints with the Domestic Trade and Consumer Affairs Ministry if there were restaurants which imposed unreasonable prices.

He noted that labour shortage was a more pressing problem for Presma members.

"Locals are not interested to work in the (food) sector while foreign workers have yet to be allowed to enter the country."

"Even if restaurants are allowed to operate for 24 hours again, most owners will probably opt out as it will add to higher overhead costs and with a lower volume of customers," he said.

## Fama: Shop at farmers' markets

**PASIR SALAK:** Essential perishables including chicken at farmers' markets are now being sold at reasonable prices to avoid burdening consumers, says the Federal Agricultural Marketing Authority (Fama).

Its chairman Datuk Mohd Fasiah Mohd Fakieh said traders and entrepreneurs under Fama could market their agricultural produce directly to farmers' markets to enable these items to be sold at cheaper prices.

He said by selling directly from farms, traders and entrepreneurs could exclude middlemen who made about 20% to 30% profit.

"We are hoping to source directly from the farms for sale at farmers' markets under Fama."

"For example, prices can drop by RM6 to RM7 a kilogramme if we source supplies like chicken directly from farms," he told reporters after visiting Kampung Gajah My Rakyat and Permanent Farmers' Market here on Saturday. — Bernama
